End of Year Giving



Hello Hope family and team!

What a year! This year will go down in history as the year of forced rest, uncertainty, recalibration and growing trust in God's ability to provide for His people.

In March, like the rest of you, Hope families entered into a season of quarantine, some experiencing Covid-19. School ended abruptly for children and mothers resorted to finishing semesters on line.

The coaching, which is a vital part of Hope, changed to zoom, The Landing Event Center, used to raise money for Hope, and support our community, shut down when even small events were cancelled by the State of Texas for the welfare of all.

The growing Hope event, Women Empowering Women, shut down in April and we were unable to reschedule, as Northeast Texas Community college stopped the use of the theatre for community protection.

One thing we did not notice is that God did not slow the number of applicants to Hope and we continued to grow by faith over the pandemic adding three mothers, four children and two seniors desiring purpose and transformation. Miraculously mothers did not lose work primarily thanks to Broncy Donkey Leather company, Brookshire's grocery store and The Market on 67.

During this time, we trained Memphis TN, Rochester, New York and worked with Porto Alegre Brazil with budgets and training for their opening slated by the end of the year.

Though our generous donors, the skeet shoot event raised \$28,560. This was \$10,000 higher than last year!

We received the news of the cancellation of the 2020 chili cook-off. We invite you with join us as The Market on 67 assists Hope with a fundraiser to make up our budget deficit of \$30,000 by holding a Christmas shopping event at the landing November 12-14.

The opportunity we have waited for, the purchase of an additional apartment complex from the housing authority approaches in January of 2021. We have faithfully saved and we are excited to share that we only have a remaining balance of \$200,000 in order to pay cash for the new complex. The plans are to remodel the apartments for wheelchair accessibility, expand the current activity center, add a security fence, and move the Hope offices. The addition will add to our ability to serve 26 additional mothers through Hope and seniors through Worthies' Way.

Thank you so much for your encouraging help during this time. We never knew when someone would stop by with food, leave a \$100, or buy gift cards for groceries at Brookshire's. Calvary Bible cooked meals for seniors at Worthies' Way for the entire pandemic!

You can know that you are part of doing something permanent to change a persons life forever. We have students entering nursing school, majoring in education, sociology, psychology, obtaining GEDs, and working towards business ownership. This is a wonderful group of hardworking mothers, healing children and supportive loving seniors. They are working hard for breakthrough to change cycles that have held their families back, sometimes for generations. As they change, our nation's future changes for the positive.
